# SMA Survey on Specialist Fees in Singapore

#### INTRODUCTION

Following the withdrawal of the SMA Guideline on Fees (GOF) with effect from 1 April 2007, it was decided to conduct surveys on the cost of GP clinic practice costs, as well as specialist fees, in Singapore.

The two surveys are intended to provide information, to both the profession and the public, on the prevailing charges of medical services in the private sector. The SMA survey on GP Clinic Practice Costs was published in the November 2007 issue of *SMA News*.

This report outlines the first SMA Survey on Specialist Fees in Singapore which was conducted from February to August 2008.

#### **METHODOLOGY**

Self-administered questionnaires (see Appendix A) were sent to a list of 152 specialists in private practice, who were randomly selected from the register of medical specialists at the Singapore Medical Council website at http://www.smc.gov.sg. Respondents in the following specialties were targeted:

- Cardiology
- Cardiothoracic Surgery
- Gastroenterology
- General Surgery
- Hand Surgery
- Neurology
- Obstetrics & Gynaecology

- Ophthalmology
- Orthopaedic Surgery
- Otorhinolaryngology
- Paediatric Surgery
- · Plastic Surgery
- · Respiratory Medicine
- Urology

The 152 specialists were selected by picking every fifth name in the above specialties. Should the name belong to a specialist in public service, the next name on the list would be selected as long as it belonged to a private specialist.

The questionnaires did not contain any serial numbers to ensure respondents' confidentiality. To ensure returns, SMA staff followed up with the selected respondents. Completed questionnaires were put into a sealed box when SMA staff visited the doctor's clinic for collection of the questionnaires.

#### **RESULTS**

A total of 78 questionnaires were returned. The response rate was 51.3%.

Of those who did not adjust their fees, the reasons were:

- · No increase in patients.
- Did not see the need to raise fees.
- Charges are already fair and adequate.
- Able to maintain operating costs.
- Remain competitive.

Of those who raised their fees, the reasons were:

- GST increase.
- Generally no increase except for special cases corporate clients.
- Increase in rental/payroll/operating costs/overheads.
- Removal of SMA Guideline on Fees.
- · Inflation.

None of the respondents lowered their fees in the last 12 months.

#### CONCLUSIONS

This survey was conducted to give us an idea of specialist fees. Unfortunately, our response rate was only 51.3% despite repeated attempts by SMA staff to persuade the non-responders to submit their forms. We also appreciate that it is difficult to compare procedures in different specialties and the SMA believes that this may contribute to the wide variation in charges within each category of surgical procedure.

Nonetheless, the range of fees between the 10<sup>th</sup> and 90<sup>th</sup> percentiles still provides us with valuable information.

We look forward to your feedback and suggestions so that we can provide more accurate data on specialist fees in our future surveys.
