he Malaysian Medical
Council recently organised
the MMA National CPD
Symposium in Grand
Seasons Hotel, Kuala
Lumpur on 29 March 2009. I had the
honour of being the SMA Council
representative, as an invited guest speaker.

The objectives of holding this symposium were to determine the status of CPD in Malaysia, and to hear from countries with an existing CME/CPD programme, such as Indonesia, Thailand, and Singapore. Of note, Singapore is the only ASEAN country where CME is compulsory, as failure to meet the requirement would mean that a doctor will not be able to renew his practicing certificate.

We started off by sharing the experiences in our respective countries, followed by speakers from Malaysia's various professional bodies who gave their input on how their organisations implement CPD. A press conference was held, officiated by
